Interfaith Immigrant Legal Assistance Fund

"We in the United States are in the midst of a complex humanitarian crisis related to immigrants that has worsened as immigrants are marginalized and treated inhumanely by our government. In these times, immigrants without legal status in the U.S. have few resources with which to obtain critical legal counsel and legal services related to their <u>immigration</u> case. It is the underlying tenet of many faith traditions to "welcome the stranger", not to oppress them, to love them as we love ourselves, and also to freely give to the poor. It is for these reasons that this Interfaith Immigrant Legal Assistance Fund has been established to help provide immigrants without legal status with financial assistance for their legal needs related to their immigration case."

The Interfaith Immigrant Legal Assistance Fund (IILA), founded in 2020, provides immigrants without legal status who reside in south Hampton Roads with financial assistance for their legal needs related to their immigration case, including immigration attorney fees and immigration case filing fees. Grants are available up to a maximum of \$500. To contribute to the IILA, please make donation checks payable to Church of the Ascension, with a note in the memo line "Interfaith Immigrant Legal Assistance Fund" and mail to: Church of the Ascension, Attention: Interfaith Immigrant Legal Assistance Fund" and Road Va. Immigration Simulations - Opinions tend to run high about the issue of immigration, but often our shared set of facts runs low. If we're going to think faithfully about immigration, it's important that we share an understanding of how immigration works or doesn't work today—and maybe dispel some myths or misunderstandings that we didn't even know we had. **IILA** offers an **Immigration Simulation** developed by the Office of Social Justice of the Christian Reformed Church, which presents basic immigration policy to better understand the citizenship process: Who is eligible for citizenship? How do they apply? How long does the process take? The overall goal of this session is to equip participants to both combat harmful misinformation, as well as to develop compassion through a deeper understanding of what undocumented immigrants face. As the primary purpose of **IILA** is to provide legal assistance to immigrants in need, the seminar will conclude with a request for participants to help in this important work. In addition to financial support, participants also will be asked to consider legislative advocacy and others forms of support such as Letters to the Editor, encouraging other organizations they are affiliated with to sponsor additional sessions, and dispelling myths when they are encountered.
