Dear Father Paul, friends of the Sacred Heart, and the greater community,



I am glad to report that the school year has officially ended. All classes took their final exams. Also, the 9th (24 students) and 13th (23) Grades took their national exams. Teachers, administrators, and students worked hard to catch up from a late start of the school year. Today, I met with the middle and high school teachers for an annual evaluation. On Monday, we will start a one-week summer, to keep students engaged in social and physical activities. To keep them safe and give them a daily lunch. Also, we will have the school repainted. Additionally, we will install a water filtering system at the rectory, which will help us to save some funds by not purchasing gas, and charcoal but filtering our wells' water ourselves.

TRAVELING TO HAITI Our last trip to our twin parish, St. Gabriel, Lascahobas, dates to early March 2020. The participants were Laura, William, and Patricia. Fr. Ady Mytial, Pastor at St. Gabriel at the time was our gracious host. He came to pick us up in the Dominican Republic, since Port-au-Prince was and still is not a safe place to be. Sadly, that same month, Neil Walsh, Director of Social Ministry at Sacred Heart Church for 18 years, 2002-2020 returned to his Maker, leaving a big legacy for social justice and the option for the poor and vulnerable. May his soul rest in peace and eternal light shine upon him. **The US Department of State has placed Haiti at Level 4: Do not travel to Haiti due to kidnapping, crime, civil unrest, and others.**



SHARING STORIES FROM ST. GABRIEL | Starting this month, we will share stories that we experienced during our bi-annual visits, 21, to our twin parish.

St. Gabriel Parish is situated in Lascahobas, near the Dominican Republic, in a lush and quiet valley surrounded by beautiful mountains. Wednesdays and Saturdays are market days on Stenio Vincent Street. Those are big days for the locals. One can find fresh fruit and vegetables, oil, sugarcane syrup, large amounts of rice, beans, clothes, shoes, school supplies and many other items. Additionally, one can purchase goats, mules, horses, pigs, and chickens. Many locals walk to the market from their homes in town, and more

climb down the mountains on foot, on horses or mules bringing their produce to the market, including bags of charcoal. Some merchants set tables along the main street. Many more sit on a groundcover with their merchandise around them. It is a vibrant place filled with people buying, selling, and catching up with one another. We often stop and talk with a merchant or two that we recognize. Our favorite food to get there is some fried dough with some herring paste in the center. We exchange a few words and large smiles with the family that fry them in a large cauldron.



One day, when market day was ending, we noticed a frail and older lady, gleaning some small beans (pois Congo) in the cracks of the sidewalk. She was picking up those beans, one at a time and placed them in a small plastic bag. Our hearts sank as we looked at her from the opposite side. We crossed the and joined her in picking up some beans. She remained silent, her eyes on the ground, busy with her chores. Were those beans for herself, for her family at home?

As that moment, we remembered Neil Walsh saying: "I do not go to Haiti to change Haiti, I go to Haiti to be changed." That evening, we reflected on this bible verse: Leviticus 23:22 "When you reap the harvest of your land, moreover, you shall not

reap to the very corners of your field nor gather the gleaning of your harvest; you are to leave them for the needy and the alien. I am the LORD your God." Gleaning in Haiti is a way to survive.

FUTURE PLANNING | On April 29th, at the Eastern Vicariate Haiti Twinning Ministry Gathering at St. Gregory the Great, in VA Beach, **Maggie Keenan**, Ed. D, Director of Planned Giving, Catholic Community Foundation made an excellent presentation on her work at the diocese. Maggie is responsible for all aspects of the Foundation's planned giving program and manages the administration of charitable gift annuities and bequests. Endowment Funds | Endowment funds established through the Catholic Community Foundation are excellent vehicles for donors wishing to provide long-term support for parishes, schools, and diocesan ministries. They especially ensure that the corpus of the donation is preserved, while 4% of a 3-year rolling average as of Dec. 31st is available for use each year for the beneficiary providing a perpetual stream of income. **Current Endowments** | There are 2 endowments for St. Gabriel School: the first, for scholarships (St. Gabriel Scholarship, Haiti Fund #114), the second, for teachers (Teacher's Salaries at St. Gabriel, Lascahobas, Haiti Fund #174).
