


# HAITI TWINNING MINISTRY (HTM) NEWSLETTER




HISTORY: BATAILLE DE VERTIÈRES—November 18th, 1803, 220 years ago!

Students studied an important moment in history. The Battle of Vertières was the last major battle of the over 12-year Haitian Revolution. It was fought on Nov. 18<sup>th</sup>, 1803, between the indigenous Haitian army and Napoleon's French expeditionary forces, who were committed to regaining control of the island. In this clash, south of Le Cap Haitians led by Jean-Jacques Dessalines and Alexandre Pétion ultimately defeated the French troops under General Rochambeau. Vertières is situated south of Cap-Haïtien, North, Haiti.

**SHARING STORIES FROM ST. GABRIEL** | Market Day in Lascahobas is on Saturdays. On that day, farmers walk down the mountains to bring their produce, some by mules, some by donkeys, some by horses, and most by foot. In town, that day, additional merchants join the crowd. They bought their goods in bulk in Port-au-Prince, Hinche, or Mirebalais and



sell them at retail prices. Also, one cannot fail to notice the hard-working Haitians who made charcoal in the heat of the day and arranged it in large jute bags placed on the back of a donkey. Much of the population relies on charcoal and wood fuel as their main source of energy.

Many merchants arrange their goods in stalls and bring a chair or two from home. Country people sit or squat on the ground covered with a tarp. There are all types of merchants. Those rarely noticed are the children, winding in and out of allay ways, carrying a basin on their heads, loaded with soda cans, small pouches of water, toiletry etc. We often bought articles from them. One of them told us that he was saving to one

day go to school.

The focus of the community that day is the open street market. Everyone arrives in town to either sell, purchase, or both. Many parishioners from St. Gabriel are among those merchants. Jacqueline is one of them. On market day, we find her busy at her stall on the main street. She arranges pants, pretty dresses and colorful blouses on hangers, and socks and underwear in large baskets. Jacqueline and her husband Bernadin are the proud parents of 3 children. Two have graduated from school and one is still in school. She also serves on the Parish Council and is a member of La Chorale Flambeau, and La Grande Chorale. Jacqueline is a dear friend, and Susie's pen pal.
