NEWS FROM OUR TWIN PARISH IN HAITI, SAINT GABRIEL (SG) | School resumed at SG on Sept. 11th with the addition of the K class. The school has a pre-school, K, & grades up to 13th. This year there are 754 students. Each year, the results of the national exams are excellent.

Mrs. Kerline Pierrot has been the accredited nurse at SG School since its opening Oct. 9, 2012. The students call her Little Mother since she knows each child by name and knows their families. Her office is in the small clinic on campus. She takes care of minor injuries and administers medication as needed. Since most families cannot afford health care for their children, Mrs. Pierrot remains vigilant in detecting any signs of infections and sickness. She and her husband, Lafleur Pierrot have 6 children who have attended SG School. Her oldest son is in the seminary, and her oldest daughter is working at the local clinic. Sacred Heart sends \$100 monthly to SG to cover some medical assistance. Medication is purchased on the local economy. During her free time, Mrs. Pierrot sings in 1 of the 6 church choirs and visits the sick and the elderly. CARE FOR CREATION | Sustainable Construction

Summer 2023 made us all aware of the dramatic consequences of climate change. Resilient design can help people lead healthier, happier lives in the face of climate change. Resilient communities are designed to weather the proverbial storm and help people pick up their lives after an extremely disastrous climate event.

The Elizabeth River Project is in the process of constructing the Ryan Resilience Lab for environmentally sustainable construction practices with changing research displays and a waterside learning park to help people and businesses explore how to live and work in a coastal flood plain as seas rise. Climate resilient communities are built with durable and sustainable building designs. These designs place a premium on hardiness and incorporate design elements such as, deep, well-built foundations, pliable materials that are designed to withstand extreme weather events, alternative power and improved thermal efficiency. Along with resilient houses, the city infrastructure must be improved to meet the demands of tomorrow. We all need to adapt our lifestyles as temperatures rise.
