HIGHLIGHTED REPORT

CATHOLIC WORKER | Steve Baggarly spoke about the day, October 2nd, the birthday of Mahatma Gandhi, being the International Day for Non-Violence. He read some quotes from Gandhi on non-violence, who, along with Martin Luther King, translated Jesus' practice of non-violent resistance into large scale movements. He talked about the Catholic Worker soupline, our two stop morning outings that begin at the cemetery wall on Salter St. and then resume at the park by McArthur mall that the train runs through. The city has told us they will put No Trespassing signs up to move people out of the park. And I told the story of a longtime, previously homeless, woman who has been part of our community for 34 years and who just passed away. We held a memorial service for her at our house and it ends up that members of her daughter-in-laws family were featured in the 1960 Edwin R. Morrow documentary Harvest of about migrant farm workers. It may have been the first time the lives of poor people were examined on television in this country.
