For each one we have the name, age, clothing size and toy preference. We prefer new gifts but will accept gently used. You may give both clothing and a toy if you wish. Wrapped gifts, with the child's name and number firmly attached, must be brought to the church by Sunday, Dec. 10th.

We have the names of the children 81 8th and 9th graders at St. Gabriel parish who are in need of textbooks. We are asking for monetary donations to purchase books for these students. Earth Day: Earth Day is Monday, April 22, 2024. The theme for 2024 is *Planet vs. Plastics*. Projects for that will be addressed at the beginning of the year.

Reduction of waste: Frank invited Francesca Smith to our meeting to discuss the ways we might be able to reduce the distribution of the Bulletins at the end of Mass. She will mention to the ushers not to "push" the Bulletins but feels that they are doing much of that at this point. We really need to determine how many are left each Sunday for a few weeks to see if this is possible.

All Souls Day vacation followed, Nov. 1st-7th. 2-yard sales to help feed the children, 1 sale at a time are scheduled Nov. 4th and 18th outside Colley Ave. Antique Store. Advent Giving Tree has started online, Nov. 1st. It will provide some textbooks for 2 grades. Nov. 18th is the Battle of Vertieres celebration, the last major battle of the Haitian Revolution under Jean Jacques Dessalines. Also, various pen pal notes were sent to friend parishioners this month. Fr. Paul did the 1st quarter wire transfer in October. We are on track with the plan of supporting the following funds: scholarships, medical, teacher, lunch, and sustainable project/building and outfitting.

9. SOUP KITCHEN | Christopher

Sacred Heart Soup Kitchen serves 50 - 60 hot meals to our guests, in pesron every Sunday. Each Sunday has its own cook and serving team captain. The cooking team captains create the meal menu, acquire the ingredients, and lead the cooking volunteers. Our serving team volunteers set up the tables, plate the meal, serve our guests, and clean up the commons afterward.
