28TH UNITED NATIONS CLIMATE CHANGE CONFERENCE | COP28, the 28th United nations Climate Change Conference, was held in late Nov. in Dubai. Delegates gathering for COP28 approved a framework for a fund to help developing countries deal with the harm caused by global warming. The wealthier nations pledged to contribute at least \$260 million to the fund. The World Bank was selected to be the fund's interim host, making the funds accessible to sub-national and local organizations. This was a momentous achievement! May this be the first step in the recognition by wealthy countries of their role in changes in the environment that are disproportionately affecting poor countries. To learn more about these effects watch *The Letter: A Message for our Earth*, a 2022 documentary film presented by YouTube Originals in cooperation with the Vatican, telling the story of the Laudato Si' encyclical by Pope Francis [https://youtu.be/Rps9bs85BII]. The film was screened at the 2023 Summer Sizzlers. The Care for Creation Committee encourages you to watch the film to stimulate a parish discussion on climate change.
