**FORMATION** | HOPE 4 LIFE, Craig Eller gave this update. Hope 4 Life saves lives and helps moms. The ministry is focused in three areas (1) offer hope and support at the abortion clinics, the front line of this sad issue; we meet the moms where they are (2) provide a free ultrasound, without delay, on our medical bus; the ultrasound demonstrates the dignity of the child (most mothers then choose life) (3) help the mom with gifts, friendship, and guidance ... while she is pregnant & often after the baby's birthday. H4L started a Bible Study Program. Craig will send us information on H4L Annual Banquet. Q&R followed.

### MINISTRIES' UPDATED REPORTS

- 1. **ADVENT GIVING TREE** | Francesca read this report from Pam Housler. The Advent Giving Tree was a success this year. We were able to provide gifts for children of migrant workers on the Eastern Shore and textbooks for 8th and 9th graders at St. Gabriel School. There were a few problems with online signups. I am determined that this will not happen next year. I am going to do a dry run this summer and make sure that all problems are eliminated. We will start in November again this coming year. Gifts came in earlier with the early start date. \$4,000 were collected for the textbooks, \$3,000 from parishioners and \$1,000 from out of parish.

- 3. **CARE FOR CREATION** | Frank reported that the members of that ministry met Mon., Dec. 18<sup>th</sup> to discuss goals. The focus this year is to apply for registration with Laudato Si Platform. Clean the Street quarterly effort is scheduled for Sat., March 16, 8:45am -10:00 am. Please bring your gloves. Keep Norfolk Beautiful will provide the necessary equipment. The next meeting will be Mon. 22<sup>nd</sup>, Jan., 7:00 pm.
  - 4. <u>CATHOLIC WORKER</u> Steve gave this report. The Norfolk Catholic Worker continues to serve a meal on the street 3 mornings a week and to help house a couple dozen people. We can use volunteers on the soupline and, right now, can use ground coffee and as-large-as-possible men's winter gloves. We have an ongoing vigil against war and for nonviolence and nuclear disarmament, as well as one proclaiming Black Lives Matter, as unarmed Black people continue to disproportionately be killed. Steve distributed the latest Norfolk Catholic Worker Newsletter and the Catholic Worker Newspaper.
  - 5. <u>CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES</u> (CRS) | Frank reported that Sacred Heart is part of the VA CRS Chapter. This group meets via Zoom, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wed. of each month to discuss how CRS is addressing climate change, damage done by conflicts and wars. Also, to encourage letter writing to state legislators. Frank & Patricia will meet Sister Linh on Rice Bowl, Tues., Jan.16. If you wish to attend the CRS Chapter meeting, please contact Frank.
  - 6. **DIGNITY OF LIFE** | Patricia shared that the team that took part in the Writing Christmas Cards to Elders and the Staff <u>Workshop</u> had increased this year, from 4 to 8. The Easter Cards Workshop is scheduled, Mon., March 11, 10:00 am-11:15 am. Please bring 8 Religious Easter Cards & 8 stamps.

<u>Pro-Life</u>: A praying presence at Planned Parenthood is scheduled Jan. 15 in the morning.) Following the national march in Washington, D.C., on Jan. 19, and Richmond, Feb. 21, there will be marches in Atlanta, Feb. 22; Phoenix, March 1; Hartford, Connecticut, March 20; Denver, April 12; and Sacramento, California, April 22.

7. **HAITI TWINNING** | Francesca noted that the students at St. Gabriel ended the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of the school year with exams. School resumed Wed., Jan. 8<sup>th</sup>. The ministry sent Christmas cards to about 18 pen pals, teachers, and Fr. Fitho. The next Sale to continue helping feed 11 students annually is scheduled Sat., Jan. 20<sup>th</sup> at Ghent Village Apartments Club House, see flyer. We continue having weekly meetings with Fr. Fitho to stay closely connected. On Tues., Jan. 9, 8:00 am – 9:00 am all twin parishes in the Eastern Vicariate of the diocese will meet on Zoom to pray for

We look forward to their help with completing our mission again this year. The ministry continues to serve 50 - 60 hot meals to our guests in person every Sunday. We continue to <u>need help serving our guest from 12:30pm to 2:30pm on the 3rd and 5th Sun. of every month.</u> Our serving team volunteers set up tables, plate the meal, serve our guests, and clean up the commons afterwards. • CRISIS PREGNANCY | Wendy Manos | Vice President of Community Relations sent this note. Emma Tait will be our guest speaker at the Feb. 5<sup>th</sup> meeting. The Crisis Pregnancy Center of Tidewater is a Christ centered organization reaching out to women and families facing unplanned pregnancies. They currently operate 3 medical clinics, and 2 pregnancy centers, all known as The Keim Centers. Medical clinics offer ultrasound services, prenatal vitamins, and medical consultations. All locations offer pregnancy testing, options counseling, community referrals, practical help, parenting classes with Bible study, post abortive classes with Bible study, and discipleship classes for new believers. All services are free and confidential. They do not provide or refer for abortions.
