Luke 15:1-7 The Parable of the Lost Sheep |15 Now the tax collectors and sinners were all gathering around to hear Jesus. ² But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them."

³ Then Jesus told them this parable: ⁴ "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? ⁵ And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders ⁶ and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' ⁷ I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent.



This parable reminds us of the young people in Port-au-Prince who have been recruited into the gangs and fallen under their influence. We must realize that for their families and friends they are the lost sheep that Jesus seeks to save. As one in unity with those parents, siblings and friends who want so badly for their loved one to be rescued from the clutches of evil and returned to their loving community, we pray as we would for our own child.

We also see in the scripture that Jesus doesn't simply extricate the lost one from the evil forces, but he RETURNS THE LOST SHEEP TO THE FOLD—calling

the community to embrace him/her with acceptance, love, support, and protection when he is safely home again. So, we pray, too, for the families and faith community in that way.

It seems that an effective prayer can be in the form of a letter to such a child. I offer my version below as an example.

Son, It has been 14 years since the earthquake destroyed our home and neighborhood in Port-au-Prince. That day, your brothers and sisters lost all that was familiar and dear to them, including our church and your school. As if that was not enough, we also lost you Jean-Sébastian. For weeks we looked for you under the rubble. First, in the neighborhood, then all over Port-au-Prince. The weeks became months and then a year. At that point, we thought you had died. That day was one of the saddest days in my life.

Last year, a neighbor told us he had seen you in some clips on the Internet. You were holding a gun in one hand and a homemade bomb in the other. I was shocked to picture you this way.

When you graduated from the 8th grade, the year before the earthquake, the whole family rejoiced, and prayed for you as you prepared to go to high school. Your dad would have been equally proud if he had not died of a bad case of diabetes. You were our first child to graduate. I have so many good memories of you from the day you were born to the very day I lost you, Tuesday, January 12th, 2010.

Please know that your siblings, aunts, uncles, and cousins survived the earthquake and we all have started a new life in Mirebalais. We hear news of gang members roaming through the streets day and night creating much havoc in the capital. Thinking about you among them prevents me from sleeping at night.

I beg you to remember that your family loves you and is waiting for you to come back to us. We are praying each day for your safe return. God is a merciful God. He loves each of us as His children. He loves you Jean-Sébastian. He wishes you well. May He protect you as you turn your back from distraction and face the light of your freedom. You are in our prayers always. We are glad you are alive. Keep safe and come home.

TEACHER ENDOWMENT FUND FOR ST. GABRIEL SCHOOL | The Haiti Ministry continues its 5-year plan to help St. Gabriel School to become increasingly self-sustaining despite challenging times. We are getting to the end of the 3rd year. This is done by funding some of the operation costs: lunch, teachers' salaries, medical needs, scholarships, some self-sustaining projects such as a stationery shop; and making the school appeal to paying parents. We are also planning for the long-term financial support of the school. Two endowments have been started by two generous families, **the Scholarship Fund, and the Teacher Fund**. The goal is to be able to send our twin parish 20 scholarships annually (\$275 each), and at least one full teacher salary for the year (\$1,300).
