She left program flyers and rack cards about the CCEVA programs and ways that parishioners can help and/or be helped.

Tim Giddens, <u>GHENT AREA MINISTRY</u> Project Director gave an overview of his work. GAM has a clothes-closet and a food pantry. It also provides bus tickets. It refers clients to services as needed. GAM collaborates with various churches synagogues, ODU and schools in Norfolk. The next Board meeting is March 7th. The Annual Board Lunch with community supporters will be April 17.

MINISTRIES' UPDATED REPORTS

- 1. BREAD FOR THE WORLD'S OFFERING OF LETTERS | Mike reported that he will do this legislative advocacy ask, April 20th and 21st after each Mass, in the Commons. See bulletin notes.
- 2. <u>CARE FOR CREATION</u> | Frank reported that Clean the Street will occur Sat. March 16th, 8:15-10 am. Please bring your gloves. Keep Norfolk Beautiful will supply the equipment needed. Announcements were made at Masses. The next meeting will be March 18th, 7:00 pm-8:30 pm.
- 3. CATHOLIC WORKER | Frank read Steve's report. Norfolk Catholic Worker continues to serve a meal on the street 3 mornings a week and to help house a couple dozen people. We can use volunteers on the soupline and, right now, can use ground coffee and as-large-as-possible men's winter gloves. We have an ongoing vigil against war and for nonviolence and nuclear disarmament, as well as one proclaiming Black Lives Matter, as unarmed Black people continue to disproportionately be killed.

Academy Award season is upon us and the film "Oppenheimer" is nominated for 13 Oscars.

On Friday, March 8, two days before the Hollywood extravaganza, Hampton Roads Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons will bring life-size cutouts of J. Robert Oppenheimer to Newport News Shipbuilding and call for an end to their construction of Columbia-class submarines, the next generation of nuclear capable ballistic missile subs.

The vigil will take place from 2-3:15 pm at the intersection of Huntington Ave. and 41st St.

CRS is tracking the Farm Bill and opposing American Farmers Feed the World since this bill would only assist countries in need with direct aid with no programs for self-sustainability, and development.
