Nancy Perry, **VA Supportive Housing** (VSH) gave this report. VSH is very pleased to announce its plans to break ground on the renovation and expansion of Gosnold Apartments at this time next year (spring of 2025). The project will include a complete renovation of the current structure and an expansion that will bring 40 additional units, thus allowing VSH to take in 40 more individuals in the area who have been experiencing long-term homelessness. This increase from 60 to 100 units will make Gosnold Apartments the largest permanent housing building in the State of Virginia. While this is a sizeable project and will take a considerable amount of time to complete, no current residents will be without housing. During the phased building process, residents of Gosnold will be offered housing in a nearby efficiency-style motel with full amenities that one would find in a small apartment. VSH will do everything possible to make the temporarily displaced residents as comfortable as possible during the construction process. As partners in Virginia Supportive Housing's journey to help to end homelessness in Virginia, Father Paul and members of Sacred Heart's parish are so very much appreciated. 2. <u>CATHOLIC WORKER</u> | Steve sent this report.

We are in our 30th year of preparing for our morning soupline at the Sacred Heart kitchen. We are at the church on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday for an hour or so, preparing for the following morning's serving. We serve on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday mornings from 6-9 am. There are some 150 volunteers who make sandwiches, boil eggs, collect clothing and toiletries or help us to serve.

We serve 50-70 people each morning on the street, and we make 60 bag lunches each week to share with people living at the city shelter. We'll serve some 9,000 meals on the street this year and provide the shelter with another 3,000. Thank you, Sacred Heart. Our Tuesday sandwiches continue to be wrapped in wax paper by the Unitarian Universalists. No other church does it.

3. CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES (CRS)

Patricia reported CRS Support this part of the Farm Bill: Food for Peace Title II delivers U.S.-sourced agricultural commodities as well as cash, vouchers and locally procured food to people facing crises, and works with communities that are susceptible to recurrent shocks to improve and sustain their food and nutrition security through **non-emergency programs called Resilience Food Security Activities**. These are unique, multi-year programs that support communities facing chronic hunger or recovering from an emergency by strengthening the resilience of people, communities, countries, and systems in a way that reduces vulnerability and facilitates inclusive growth. Food for Peace programs help address the root causes of hunger through activities such as creating savings groups, training farmers on resource management, or working with new mothers to improve nutrition for themselves and their baby.

4. **DIGNITY OF LIFE** | Francesca reported that the Sacred Heart 2024 Baby Items Collection is ongoing April 27-May 19. Pick up by Crisis Pregnancy is May 13 & by Hope 4 Life, May 20. We thank all parishioners who have generously participated in bring hope to families served by those two organizations.

HAITI TWINNING | The Parish 17th Anniversary in Twinning, May 5th went very well with dinner (Dan), live music (Kiera), raffle (William), MC (William) Guest speaker Kathy Dowdy, Haiti Education Support Team Chair, 42 guests and an excellent team of volunteers.
