#### MINISTRIES' UPDATED REPORTS & IMPACTS 2023-2024

#### 1. BACKPACK DRIVE | CHILDREN ON EASTERN SHORE

Susan reported that as of tradition, Sacred Heart conducted an annual Backpack and School Supply Drive in July 2023. This ministry supports St. Peter the Apostle's Parish in Onley. **This ministry impacted 88 children.** Susan will be the new coordinator of this ministry this year. She and her grandchildren will make sure that the backpacks will be filled with all required school supplies. The drive will be July 20<sup>th</sup>-August 11<sup>th</sup>. # 2. ADVENT GIVING TREE

Pam sent this report. In early November we get a list of the names, ages, sizes, and gift requests for 70-100 children, infants to age 12 from our partner parish on the Eastern Shore. Parishioners take the name and information for a child (or children), buy, and wrap the gifts and return them to the church. A member of the migrant ministry team from St. Peter the Apostle's Parish in Onley comes to take the gifts to the children's parents so that the children will have gifts to open on Christmas Day. In 2023, 53 children received Christmas gifts (clothes and toys).

Each year the pastor at our twin parish, St. Gabriel, in Haiti tells us of a need for the children there. It has been various things over the years (cement and rebar to build the school, utensils for the new cafeteria, playground equipment, textbooks for the expanding student body). Parishioners make monetary gifts in whatever amount is comfortable for them and the money is wire transferred to the Haitian pastor for purchasing what the need for that year is. In 2023, Grades 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>, 83 students received some textbooks.

This ongoing program affects hundreds of children, and a great number of parishioners, spreading the love of the Advent and Christmas season to those who need it most. **POC:** Pam Housler pamhousler@cox.net

# 5. CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES

Patricia reported that CRS Rice Bowl | During the 40 days of Lent, via bulletin notes, Constant Contact, and presence in the Common at a collection table, parishioners reflected on the impact of global hunger and climate change on vulnerable communities around the word, and we prayed, fasted, and gave alms to help our sisters and brothers in need in three countries: Uganda, El Salvador, and Indonesia. Also, 25% of the collection remained in the USA.

Sacred Heart is a member of CRS VA Chapter, 2 monthly meetings: State, and National to learn about the Farm Bill, the international outreach part of the Bill, and how to approach both our Senators' and Representative's staff on virtual (April 2024) visit. # 6. CATHOLIC WORKER

Steve sent this report. We are in our 30<sup>th</sup> year of preparing for our morning soupline at the Sacred Heart kitchen. We are at the church on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday for an hour or so, preparing for the following morning's serving. We serve on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday mornings from 6-9 am. There are some 150 volunteers who make sandwiches, boil eggs, collect clothing and toiletries or help us to serve. We serve 50-70 people each morning on the street and we make 60 bag lunches each week to share with people living at the city shelter. We'll serve some 9,000 meals on the street this year and provide the shelter with another 3,000. Thank you, Sacred Heart. #### 9. SOUP KITCHEN

Christopher sent this report. In the past year, the Sacred Heart Soup Kitchen served between 45 and 55 **hot** meals to our guests every Sunday. Typically turn-out is low on Sundays of inclement weather or pay weeks. We have noticed that an increasing portion of our guests are working poor. The soup kitchen is still recovering from the effects of the pandemic. Volunteers and donations from regular sources are down and difficult to find. Each Sunday has its own cook and serving team captain. We are grateful for the cooking team captains who have continued and thankful for our serving teams who returned. We are still in need of serving volunteers from 12:30 pm - 2:30 pm on the 3rd and 5th Sundays. The cooking team captains create the meal menu, acquire the ingredients, and lead the cooking volunteers. Our serving team volunteers set up the tables, plate the meal, serve our guests, and clean up the commons afterward. Last February we held our annual dry goods drive to restock our pantry. The drive was not as successful as the previous year. We plan on holding the dry goods drive again next February.
